

Monday, July 18, 6:30PM
Actor Kevin Wood portrays Lincoln in his program titled "A New Birth of Freedom." This first-person presentation covers Lincoln's life, from Independence through the Civil War focusing on the turbulent years of 1854-1865. All programs are funded by Friends of the Whitefish Bay Public Library.

Kevin Wood portrays President Abraham Lincoln, one of our nation's most beloved and esteemed historical figures. He has made appearances at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Museum, the Lincoln Home National Historic Site, the Lincoln Heritage Museum, the Chicago History Museum, and Lincoln's Festival on Route 66, among many other places and events. Kevin J. Wood has appeared as Mr. Lincoln in 31 States!

Eleanor Roosevelt: First Lady of the World

Monday, August 15, 6:30PM
Join us for an evening with Eleanor Roosevelt, played by actress Jessica Michna. In this first-person presentation, Eleanor Roosevelt shares with the audience her tragedies and triumphs. Born into the opulent wealth of America's "Golden Age" she would grow from the shy, homely orphan into a confident, driven woman. Annealed by personal tragedy, she would emerge as a champion of civil rights, author, and stateswoman. Eleanor has been characterised by many as our most respected First Lady. She is best summed up by President Harry S. Truman, who dubbed her "The First Lady of the World."

About the speaker: Originally from Pennsylvania, Jessica Michna developed a love of history at an early age. She and her family visited the many historic sites throughout America. Her school years would find her appearing in various productions, in addition to costume design and construction. Upon graduation several scholarships were offered to further her studies in theater arts. She would opt to earn a degree in psychology from the UW system while working several years as a researcher and lecturer.

Libby (formerly Overdrive)
Download eBooks and audiobooks with [Wisconsin's Digital Library](#). To download on your smartphone or tablet, do a search in your app store for Libby. Libby is the app that you can use on multiple devices to access digital content from the library. Log in with your library card and PIN to get started. You can get help with Libby [here](#).

Magazines from Libby
Check out complete digital editions of popular magazines - and keep them as long as you want, now as a part of [Libby/Wisconsin's Digital Library](#). Either perform a search for a favorite title or choose 'Collections' and arrow down to find magazines. Under 'Collections', Magazines, you may browse by category. Checkouts can be for either 7, 14, or 21 days.
