
Closed December 14 - 16 Closed December 24 - 25

Celebrate the first day of winter by picking up a kit to make an adorable egg carton snow person. We ask that you take one craft kit per child.


CountyCat App

Have you downloaded the new CountyCat App? One new cool feature is the ability to check out Whitefish Bay Library items while in the library using the app on your phone! To use this feature, scroll down to 'Self Check' found on the bottom of the app home screen.

After selecting 'Self Check,' it will ask you to 'Enable Location Services.' Then click the button 'Check-out' to begin.

To check-out items, you'll need to scan the RFID tag found on the item, usually on the back. For a book, just flip the book over and scan the back cover.

If this is your first time, stop by any service desk at the library and staff can walk you through the process.
