
Sign up online beginning January 16 through **Beanstack**. For every 2 hours that

Sign up online beginning January 16 through Beanstack. For every hour that you read, earn tickets to enter into drawings. Win gift cards to local businesses. thought she had experienced it all. But she hadn't experienced autism. After trying more traditional methods of dealing with autism, Kathie and her husband set it all aside to focus on their daughter, her needs, her requests, and her way of reaching out. Now an adult, Olivia is a Dean's List student in her senior year of college. She embraces her autism as a unique part of herself. One April, Kathie challenged herself to write a haiku a day about Olivia and about

autism to observe both National Poetry Month and Autism Awareness Month. This book is the result of that challenge. The final poem is by Olivia herself. Join author and poet Kathie Giorgio and her daughter Olivia for an open discussion about autism, it's impact on their relationship, and what it was like working together on this book. 
