Friends of the Whitefish Bay Public Library 2021 Annual Report

Our mission Statement is: to provide appropriate and sufficient financial and volunteer resources in support of the Whitefish Bay Public Library's mission.

To help accomplish our mission the Board held 10 regular meetings in 2021, some via Zoom. We also had some fun socializing at Schoolhouse Park in August. We brought our own lunches and enjoyed the beautiful afternoon.

The Friends awarded two \$500 scholarships to Whitefish Bay High School Seniors. They were judged by an essay about how the library has influenced their lives. We received 13 entries. The essays were published in the Fall *PageTurner* along with the students' pictures, college choices and areas of study.

We held a July book sale for Friends' members only and it was a hit. We invited booksellers to come in and buy books several times during the year when we couldn't have our regular sales. We were able to resume our regular book sale in November and we had record results. People who patronized the book sale were delighted to have a book sale again. We were not able to have the three prior regular book sales because of the COVID epidemic.

3. Membership

As of November 30th, we have 155 members. Last year at this time we had 131 members!

This was another year of change for the Friends. A few programs and activities remained the same. Other activities had to stop or were on-again and off-again. We were finally able to get back to having book sales: the Friends only sale in July and our regular book sale in November. Sales of books continued strong through eBay throughout the pandemic. Membership dues remained steady (thank you, Friends!) and our Book Room Sales were strong while the library and the room could remain open.

We look forward to getting back to business in 2022 when the pandemic subsides, and all our normal activities can be resumed.
