The Whitefish Bay Public Library has a strong and treasured history in the community. In 2017, we celebrate our 80th year – having opened on February 14, 1937, in the basement of the old Village Hall. The "old library" served the community from 1955-2002, at the same location on Marlborough Drive. In 2002, the current



building opened, having been built over the basement of the old library and expanded northward.



Our library is more than just a building and books; the library has (and had) many superb and dedicated staff, who bring the library alive for patrons: by leading storytimes, facilitating book clubs, and planning engaging programs for children, teens and adults.

Thanking our community Even more than the building, books, and staff, the library is a gathering place for the community. Many community members have donated their time to help the library be a welcoming and excellent place. Community members also donate books to the library. The group, *Friends of the Whitefish Bay Library*, spend significant time sorting books for our book sales, which generate revenue for enhancements at the library. Library Board of Trustees members contribute their expertise to leading the library.

Appreciating Denis McGuire

In particular, I would like to highlight the contributions of Denis McGuire to the library and to the whole Whitefish Bay community. Denis lived in Whitefish Bay with his wife, Linda, and their sons, Nolan and Darren. Denis passed away in 2012, but Linda continues to live in the community and contribute to the library as a *Friends'* volunteer. Thankfully due to her volunteer work, we were able to answer one of the first questions I encountered as the director in 2014: who designed the library logo?



I had heard the logo was picked in a contest, but could find no details in library files. (This is



why it is important to save things!) Thankfully, Friends members put me in touch with Linda, who provided me with a copy of the original brochure put out by the "Whitefish Bay Public Library Art Committee," who held a Village Artists exhibit in 2003. During this exhibit, they announced the winner of the logo contest. I quickly made a scan of the brochure to add to our archives.

As it turns out, Denis also designed the Friends of Whitefish Bay Library logo. With simple and elegant designs, Denis McGuire projected the persona of each institution to the community. We greatly appreciate his contribution to the Whitefish Bay Public Library.
