Appy Spring! 2017 was a very successful year for the Friends. Our May and November book sales were highly profitable as were book sales on EBay and in the Book Room at the library. These efforts resulted in the Friends' contribution of \$35,250 to the library. You may notice new furniture appearing over the next several years in the library – this will be the main use of the Friends' contributions.

Our spring book sale is just around the corner! Our preview night for members of the Friends will be held on Friday, May 4th. Not a Friend yet? You can sign up on Friday night at the book sale. The sale continues on Saturday, May 5 and Sunday May 6. Sunday, May 6 is our bag sale – a chance to fill a large grocery bag for only \$5.

I'm delighted to introduce a new member of the team! Francine Curtis is now our Book Donation Coordinator. She is actively contacting consignment shops, estate sales, realtors and schools to find sources of high quality used books and media. We created this new position because our sources of "raw material" are critical for the book sales, Book Room in the library and EBay sales. I'm sure Francine's efforts will result in new sources of books.

The Friends are active in two other spring events. We sponsored the sixth annual writing contest. The entries have been submitted and the writing contest reception was held on Wednesday, April 4th. The winners read their entries and received their prizes.

Our other spring event is Whitefish Bay Recycle Day in the Bay on Saturday, May 5th from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. We will have a table at Dominican High School and be collecting gently used books, videos, CDs/records and toys, games and puzzles. Please consider donations as you do a little spring-cleaning.
